Not a week passes when I don't read a story in a newspaper, magazine or journal about a data breach. A hacker breaks into a database and steals thousands of credit card numbers, a rouge employee walks out the corporate door with a laptop full of trade secrets, a government employee is caught accessing the private data of political opponents.

Data privacy and security responsibilities often include records and information managers. It is a topic all RIM professionals need to become better acquainted with. Implications of Web-based, Collaborative Technologies in Records Management: An American National Standard

On January 13, 2011, ANSI/ARMA 18-2011, *Implications of Web-Based Collaborative Technologies in Records Management*, was approved as an American National Standard.

A team of professionals from government, education, and the private sector *lead by Pat Franks, CNYARMA Board Member*, developed this standard to provide guidance to records and information management professionals charged with applying records management practices to the use of internally-facing or externally directed (public or private), web-based, collaborative technologies, such as wikis, blogs, mashups, and classification (tagging) sites. Adherence to Generally Accepted Recordkeeping Principles® (GARP®) is also supported and encouraged by advice contained within this publication.

While the decision to incorporate these technologies into the day-to-day practice of records and information management directly impacts records professionals, for optimal results cooperation is needed from individuals in other functional areas within the organization, including (but not limited to) human resources, information technology, legal, and marketing. Therefore, this standard will be of use to not only records managers but also all individuals involved in creating or managing records and information through the use of web-based, collaborative technologies.

The PDF version of this standard is now available through the ARMA International bookstore. Print versions will be available within a few weeks.

Two-Pay Plan Option for Annual Dues

In these tough financial times, ARMA International has instituted a new payment option, which eases the burden of paying your annual dues in one payment

This is the way it works:

1. ARMA will include a form with the annual dues invoice for members to complete if they would like to pay their dues in two equal payments.
2. The two-pay plan requires the dues be paid with a credit card (Visa, MasterCard, American Express, or Discover) or a debit card with the Visa or MasterCard logo.
3. Members must provide their card information and sign an agreement allowing ARMA to process payment for half of their dues upon receipt of the form and the other half six months later. A \$5.00 processing fee will be added to each payment. We will keep this form on file.
4. ARMA will send a reminder notice to those individuals participating approximately one month prior to processing the payment for the second half of their dues.

5. The chapter dues will also be paid in two payments. Chapters will receive their chapter escrow payment as it is paid to ARMA - 50% upon the renewal and 50% six months later for members who opt for the two-pay plan.

6. ARMA cannot accept checks with this plan. The credit card information on file provides somewhat of a guarantee that the second half of the membership payment will be made - a guarantee that is not available with check payments.

Thirty-five (35) years later, the organization and the credential remains a valuable part of the Records and Information Management (RIM) community; an expanding interdisciplinary, global and diverse constituency.

The ICRM has recently completed an ambitious Strategic Business Plan, and will publish a Press Release in the near future which identifies several large initiatives. For a high-level summary, the multi-year Plan will provide for a thorough evaluation of certification standards, the Institute's current business model, formalization of its examination preparation program, and an extensive marketing plan that will support growth, awareness and a strong, globally recognized value proposition for being a Certified Records Manager (CRM).
